## The 8th Annual Focus on Robbery™ & Serious Crime Symposium

The IBP Focus on Robbery™ & Serious Crime Symposium, now in its eighth year, is widely regarded as an excellent forum for stimulating academic content, understanding latest crime trends and commercial networking.

Over 100 delegates attended last years' annual conference with senior representatives from major supermarkets, high street banks, independent ATM deployers, retailers and the cash in transit industry.

Following on from this success IBP have arranged another exciting programme with fourteen first-rate speakers confirmed for this years event.

This years Symposium is focusing on the impact of the credit crunch and will include presentations with the focus on Crime in Crisis. These will include case studies from experts in their field from the retail, cash-in-transit, banking, insurance and academic world along with presentations from the European Standards Working Group, Suzy Lamplugh Trust and Forensic Navigation Services.

Richard Childs OPM, veteran conference facilitator, formerly Lincolnshire Police Chief Constable and Managing Director of ACPO CPI, will chair the event for the 6th year in succession.

The Symposium is held at the Hayling Island Sailing Club on the south coast and the unique venue contributes to the success of the event. Held over 2 days the Symposium commences with a full itinerary of speaker presentations throughout Thursday, followed by the annual dinner which offers networking opportunities in a more informal setting. Friday consists of a morning session of speaker presentations followed, for those that wish to take part, in the IBP/Flying Squad Challenge Yacht Race.

The Focus on Robbery™ Partnership is a joint not-for-profit initiative formed in 2004 by IBP Group, to harness expertise from every discipline that has an interest in understanding the reasons for criminal behaviour, analysing the effectiveness of current reduction measures and reducing crime. The Symposium is an important part of the overall work of the partnership, that has produced many avenues of continued research benefiting those affected by robbery and other crimes of violence.

The programme on Thursday offers a full day of presentations from experts in their fields, along with time to meet exhibitors and network with delegates and speakers.

Speakers include Steven Gauge, on behalf of the Suzy Lamplugh Trust. Back by popular delegate demand, Steven returns to the Symposium for a second consecutive year (unheard of!) to pick-up on his fascinating 2008 presentation and share some valuable new thoughts on crime reduction from the work conducted by the Suzy Lamplugh Trust following the last Symposium.

The Suzy Lamplugh Trust, established in 1986 by Paul and Diana Lamplugh following the disappearance of their daughter, is a social enterprise delivering Personal Safety training and resources to the public, private and voluntary sector.

John is a chartered psychologist and specialises in the field of interrogation having served as a senior police officer in the arena of serious crime. John will provide delegates with a better understanding of what the truth looks and sounds like and how to identify the meanings of various emotional displays.

The Corporate Manslaughter & Homicide Act 2007 is legislation that could affect all organisations that are employers. Peter Camilletti is a non-practising barrister who has made a study of the Act and will be sharing his findings with us this year. With the first case of a company director to face court under this act this will be a 'must attend' presentation for the Symposium delegates.

In concluding the Focus on Robbery™ Symposium 2008, Richard Childs commented: "This has been one of the very best security conferences I have had the privilege to chair. The sheer quality of the agenda and speakers has been outstanding, plus the delegates have made an enormous contribution in the overall debate."

The 2009 Symposium is shaping up to surpass all previous years with a programme that has been widened to include presentations not only on robbery related issues but also dealing with other serious crimes.

We are pleased to be joined by John Birkenshaw who will be giving a presentation looking at Managing Crime within the Community. John served with West Yorkshire Police for thirty years and on his retirement took up the post of Crime Reduction Manager with the Safer Leeds project where he is regularly involved in community crime prevention initiatives involving CCTV, anti-knife crime and much more.

With the continued attacks on the cash in transit industry, Adam Miller probably has one of the most challenging jobs in the security industry and as Director of Risk for G4S Cash Services rarely a day goes by when there is not a robbery to deal with somewhere in the UK. Adam is at the forefront of marshalling the many stakeholders who can have an impact on cash-in-transit crime including the Home Office, ACPO, Transport for London, trade associations to name but a few. Adam will be addressing the challenging question, "Can CVIT Crime be Defeated?"

Emergency Planning and True Partnerships is the topic Graham Sunderland will be presenting. Graham, a former Assistant Chief Constable with Cumbria Constabulary, has now moved into the private sector bringing his wealth of knowledge to the area of planning, training, exercising and responding to major civil emergencies. He draws on his experience in dealing with many major incidents including the Sierra Leone hostage taking, major floods, London bombs July 2005 and the Indian Ocean Tsunami.

The Raid-control Initiative is looking to grow with the demand from retailers and will be launching a new solution aimed at Multiples, such as East of England Co-operative who are currently piloting the scheme. We welcome Linda Reakes, their Security Manager, who will give a joint presentation along with Alan Townsend, President of Raid-control and Richard Childs, Secured by Design to explain this new initiative to the Symposium.

Tim White, a former Commander with the Metropolitan Police Counter Terrorism Branch, will be giving an insight into ATM Crime within the Retail Environment. Tim recently took up the role in the new post of Head of Security for Tesco Financial Services. Amongst other things Tim looks after the newly acquired Tesco estate of 2,800 ATMs with all that this entails - Tim thought he was busy in Counter Terrorism!
