Review of Focus on Robbery Symposium 2007

The IBP Group 6th Focus on Robbery Symposium™ held in September 2007 was hailed as one of the best national security conferences by delegates from a vast array of police, industry and academic disciplines.

Nine top UK guest speakers attended including Steve Nelson, Thomas Cook Group, who discussed company preparation and responses to robbery situations; Detective Inspector Andy Smith, Met Police Flying Squad, explained the 'cradle to grave' processes of a police investigation; Kevin Tasker, Centre for Crisis Psychology, described the trauma suffered by robbery victims and how they can be helped and David Ryan, Specialist Security Consultant, described the importance of gathering, evaluating and disseminating criminal intelligence within the retail environment.

The symposium dealt with three main areas of research: 'Before, During & After a Retail Robbery', 'Evaluating & Disseminating Intelligence' and 'Cash in Transit Offenders', during which delegates were treated to a series of first class presentations from experts in their field.

Digby Ram, Managing Director of IBP Group said: "It is absolutely vital that the security industry plays its part in developing policies and strategies to tackle the big criminal issues. Working in true partnership with other interested parties in creating pioneering new measures to reduce violent crime is a goal we should all be striving to achieve - this year's symposium has been informative, dynamic and intellectually stimulating."

IBP-Group's 7th annual Focus on Robbery Symposium

Following on from the success of last years Symposium, IBP-Group have arranged another exciting programme with eleven first-rate speakers for this years event.

The Symposium will include case studies from experts in their field from the retail, cash-in-transit, ATM, banking and academic world and presentations from the European Standards Working Group, BSIA, the Flying Squad and European Security Transport Association.

In addition, and for the first time at the Symposium, delegates will be offered the opportunity to participate in a table top exercise on Tiger Kidnap incident management from one of the countries leading specialists on the subject, **David Ryan, an International Specialist Security Consultant.**

Richard Childs QPM, former Lincolnshire Police Chief Constable, and veteran conference facilitator will chair the event and will be supported by two ACPO representatives, **Acting Deputy Chief Constable Ian Seabridge, Greater Manchester Police**, and **Asst. Chief Constable Graham Sunderland, Cumbria Constabulary.**

The speakers include **Martin McInerney, Regional Security Manager for the William Hill Organisation; Graham Hand, Regional Risk Director for G4S Cash Services; John Hamilton, Head of Group Security, and Dale Bradley, Group Health & Safety Advisor, of Bradford & Bingley plc; Steven Gauge, CEO of the Suzy Lamplugh Trust; Detective Superintendent Bob Cummings of the MPS Flying Squad; and Paul Fullicks, Loomis and Chair of ESTA Security Working Group.**

The Focus on Robbery™ Partnership is a joint not-for-profit initiative formed in 2004 by IBP Group, to harness expertise from every discipline that has an interest in understanding the reasons for criminal behaviour, analysing the effectiveness of current reduction measures and reducing crime. The Symposium is an important part of the overall work of the partnership, which has produced many avenues of continued research benefiting those affected by robbery and other crimes of violence.

The programme on Thursday offers a full day of presentations from experts in their fields, along with time to meet exhibitors and network with delegates and speakers.

Speakers include Steven Gauge of the Suzy Lamplugh Trust.

Steven Gauge became Chief Executive of the Suzy Lamplugh Trust in December 2007. The Trust, established in 1986 by Paul and Diana Lamplugh following the disappearance of their daughter, is a social enterprise delivering Personal Safety training and resources to the public, private and voluntary sector.

Steven will outline the work of the Trust and how it has developed training and technical measures to help protect lone workers; a highly vulnerable section of the business community.

Another of the presentations comes from John Hamilton & Dale Bradley of Bradford & Bingley.

John Hamilton joined Bradford & Bingley plc in April 2001 as Head of Facilities with a portfolio including security, before moving in 2004 to head up a new department responsible for health, safety and security as well as business continuity.

Dale Bradley joined Bradford & Bingley plc in January 2005 as Group Health & Safety Adviser providing pragmatic advice, support and guidance to all 3200 staff.

John and Dale will address the challenges faced by security professionals when dealing with the conflicting demands of a post robbery corporate response and how Bradford & Bingley deal with the issues.
